Salmon is my favorite food to eat because of its numerous health properties. The three health properties of salmon are Omega-3, low-saturated fat, and vitamins.

Omega-3 is a fatty acid that plays an important role in reducing the likelihood of having a heart attack or stroke. It also plays a role in protecting against cancer. Additionally, Omega-3 lowers triglycerides and slows the buildup of plaque in the arteries. There are fish oil supplements, but is preferable to eat fatty fish such as salmon.

Salmon has low-saturated fat that reduces LDL (bad cholesterol) and triglycerides. The point of lowering LDL (low-density lipoprotein) is to reduce the buildup of plaque in the arteries. When LDL and triglycerides are elevated, then the risk of a heart attack increases.

Salmon contains a significant amount of vitamins that improve immune function. The most common vitamins found in salmon are vitamin A, vitamin B, and vitamin D. Vitamin A improves one's vision, growth, and immune function. Vitamin B helps the nerves and the development of new red blood cells. Lastly, vitamin D helps in maintaining proper bone structure.

Since salmon has all these important health properties, then I should make it my life mission to eat more salmon. That won't be a problem because there are millions of recipes that I could choose from the web.



The Role and Responsibilities of the First Son in Esan Culture in Nigeria

The rights and responsibilities of the first son in Esan culture are determined before he is born.

The first surviving son solely inherits the property of the departed Father. In the traditional Esan culture, the properties inheritable are usually land, economically valuable trees (palm oil trees and cocoa trees), domestic servants, animals, wives, sisters, houses, and brothers as well as spiritual powers and titles that are hereditary. (He has no choice of one without all.)

Lawful succession or inheritance is only permitted after the final burial and completed ceremony of the dead father.

The first son is fully responsible for bearing the cost of the father's funeral and for paying all outstanding debts. He is responsible for taking over all of his father's responsibilities, including caring for the father's widows, siblings and by extension the extended family.

The eldest son must provide for his siblings until they are able to stand on their own. He is indebted to allot part of the land to any of his brothers who wish to use such land for farming or building.

His brothers and sisters must be of good behavior to enjoy any such opportunities. Respect for elders in Esan culture is mandatory.

Land property or the family house are normally not to be inherited by female children because the unwritten law is that the family wealth or traditional wealth must remain in the family.

It is not allowed for the estate to be sold for whatever reason; it must be handed over to the surviving male in order of predetermined succession.

The first son must go through some tough training including tough love and toughened not to cry or show weak emotions, in order to be prepared for the role he didn't ask for.

The first son in Esan culture is both receiving and giving.

Would you like to know about the Iranian New Year's ceremony? It's called Nowruz which means "new day." Iranians have been celebrating Nowruz for more than 3000 years. Nowruz is the Persian New Year which falls on the first day of spring (on the 21st of March).

First, we would clean our houses, so that we would be ready to be hosts for our relatives and friends. We always decorate a table with very special things that started with 'S'. They are always edible.

Sabzeh/ sprouting wheat.

Seeb/apple.

Serkeh/ vinegar.

Senjed/ oleaster.

Samanoo/ a sweet desert with wheat germ.

Sumac/ sumac.



Some of these are symbols of patience, health, wisdom and happiness. Candles, painted eggs, sweets and nuts and a goldfish bowl are also placed on the table.

It is the biggest festival we have in Iran. We offer best wishes to each other. I clearly remember we would send postcards to our relatives and friends that lived faraway, to say "Happy New Year." The older members of the family would give money to the younger ones. The children would compare how much money they got.

Iranians have a special supper on New Year's Eve. It is called sabzi polo mahi, which includes a mixture of rice and various aromatic herbs and fried fish.

Last but not least, I have to tell you we have a character like Santa. His name is Ammo Nowruz. He is a kind, old man who brings presents to children.

My mother is the most important person in my life. She raised me as a single mother because my father was in the army. I love her dearly. 

- Open Gmail.
- Compose a new email.
- 3. Address it to your instructor.
- 4. Add a subject in the Subject line: Practicing Attachments.
- Click on the paperclip in the Compose window.



- File Explorer will open and you can search for the file you want to attach. It can be an image or a document.
- 7. Choose "Open" which means you are attaching the file to your email.
- 8. You will see the name of the file in the Compose window.



- 9. Write a message in the body of the email.
- 10. Reread and send.



FILE EXPLORER






Locations: The location section of file explorer is a directory/table of contents for your files. The location section can be used to navigate through the file system.

File Path: A string of names that identifies the location of a file or folder in the file system.

Content: The content section displays what is in the folder you currently have open.


